PENICILLIN INSTRUCTIONS

Your child has a dental infection that will require attention. Dr. Commarato has prescribed penicillin, an antibiotic, to help control this infection. The penicillin will help alleviate the problem but will not make it go away.

You need to give your child one teaspoon of this medicine four times a day. Continue giving the medicine until it runs out, even after your next appointment at Dr. Commarato's office. This will help to control the infection before and after the treatment. Follow the instructions from the pharmacy.

Penicillin is a common antibiotic given to children for treatment of upper respiratory infection. If your child has been given amoxicillin or penicillin before, there should not be any problems. If your child has never taken amoxicillin or penicillin, there is a very slight possibility that your child might be allergic to this medicine. If you note a rash or any other problems, do not give your child any more of the medicine and call Dr. Commarato's office at (330) 394-1516.
